Jackie Jones led us in the pledge of allegiance. Sam Engel, Sr. played

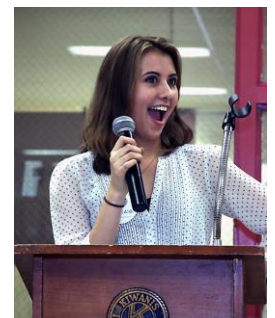


“God Bless America” while Rommil Fernandez led us in our singing. It is wonderful to have two pros leading our music.
