Program

Mary Cutone, YMCA interim COO, was today's speaker. The Y is running a summer/school



camp this year in conjunction with BUSD called Learn, Grow, Thrive. One in ten children in Burbank live in poverty. 350 Burbank first thru third graders are in danger of not finishing school because of not being able to read. There are 100 students in

the program this year. The Y staff runs the camp. The teachers are credentialed. The camp is held at Edison Elementary school and runs from 8-6 daily for 6 weeks. There are lots of fun activities as well as academics.

The goal for next year is to raise \$240,000 in order to be able to handle more students. This year they had to turn away 24 students as there were only 100 positions. It costs about \$1200 per child to run the 6 week camp.

National YMCA is maintaining a data-base to track how effective this program will be on the long term educational development of the participants.
