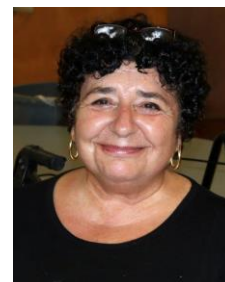

Birthdays and Anniversaries



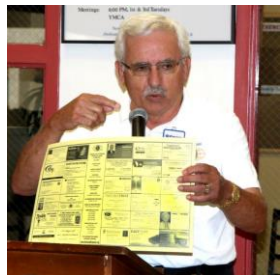
