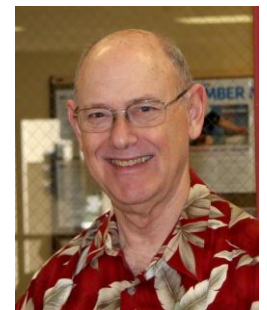
Welcome to Burbank Noon Kiwanis.
