Lucy introduced Frank Miller, Executor Director of the Hollywood Burbank Airport and shared his credentials that prove he is the man for the job to complete the replacement terminal in 5-7 years.

The brand name of our airport is 'Hollywood Burbank Airport', but the official name is still the Burbank Bob Hope Airport.



He noted that our terminal opened in May, 1930, too close to the runway and not seismically sound. We need to come into compliance with the FAA.

The voters in the City of Burbank voted to insure Burbank's say in the growth and expansion of the airport. Every issue addressing those items needs 2 votes from each city on the JPA.

The facility will be 355,000 square feet and will retain 14 gates. The terminal will cost \$400M, not including costs for parking, road access and shuttles. No local tax dollars will be used for the project. The preferred site is the old B-6 property. The main access will move to Hollywood Way and Winona, with an additional entrance at Cohasset St.

The tasks in process are community outreach, soil testing, health risk assessment, and geotechnical reports. Updating the Layout Plan will be submitted to the FAA during 2017.

From 2017-2019, the conceptual planning team will be selected, who will host public conceptual planning charrettes. The Federal National Environmental Protection Act Study will be completed.

Financial planning activities during 2017-2019 will include developing a financial plan and negotiating agreements with the airlines. From 2018-2022 the complete final design, approved by the Airport Authority after public hearings



will be submitted to the City of Burbank for building approval, followed by construction of the terminal. In 2023, the existing terminal will be demolished and the taxiways will be extended in 2024.

- **Object 6** - To cooperate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism and goodwill.
