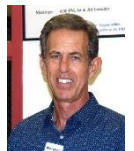
Cynthia and Harvey delivered 44 meals today to shut-ins (according to Harvey), but Cynthia corrected him to report 25 delivered.

Leonard came to the podium to announce the 44th annual Bell-Jeff Cross Country Invitational to be held on September 30 at Griffith Park. He thanked Burbank Noon Kiwanis for being stallwart supporters. He told of the freshman who broke a 35 year-old record for 2.8 miles in 15 minutes and 15 seconds. It was just one high light from last year.



Rick introduced Dale Gorman, executive director of the Children’s Dental Clinic. She thanked Burbank Noon for our support. She ran a PowerPoint that showed the emergence of the facility at McKinley Elementary School as it’s home. They strive to meet the needs of 3 – 6 year olds, the most vulnerable to decay. These children can also be taught to take care of their teeth. The clinic takes Medical using the guidelines dictated by the City of Burbank.



Janet Diel – our honoree at the Gov. visit this year – came to the podium to announce that the Burroughs Key Club and the Burbank Key Club are competing in the ‘Coins for Campers’ campaign. Dental disease is the #1 reason for school absences. The clinic has programs to not only serve as a clinic, but also to outreach to the students at the schools. They Uber patients to the clinic, monitor severe cases of cavities and disease, and train children to take care of themselves so there will be no fear of the dental visit. The clinic utilizes mentors and interns from many

- [Object 2](#) - To encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships.
- [Object 3](#) - To promote the adoption and the application of higher social, business, and professional standards.
- [Object 4](#) - To develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive, and serviceable citizenship.
- [Object 5](#) - To provide, through Kiwanis clubs, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build better communities.
- [Object 6](#) - To cooperate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism and goodwill.
