Lisa then introduced Rev. Linda Wiggins, who told us a bit about the 'Daughters of Zion' (transitioning formerly homeless women and children into their homes and the community through counseling, advocacy and mentoring) and how it came to be. She said that she tries to help those who lack support systems and are left without hope and resources.

She, herself, was a single homeless lady with a toddler and lived in her car for 3 ½ weeks. She noted that people do not ask for help because of pride.

She had a vision in 1999, and, it finally came to fruition in 2012. Her goal is to 'nurture individuals to full growth.' She moves people from homelessness to homes, so they learn how to manage in that atmosphere, such as how to cook and how to parent.

Homelessness is not all drugs and mental illness, sometime educated, hardworking people fall into hard times.

In response to questions, she says she helps people by partnering with other organizations and people. She finds clients by going to homeless shelters

Of course, she was presented with the traditional fine china mug and picked the 'winning ticket'.

The Objects of Kiwanis

The six permanent Objects of Kiwanis International were approved by Kiwanis club delegates at the 1924 Convention in Denver, Colorado. Through the succeeding decades, they have remained unchanged.

- **Object 1** - To give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to the material values of life.
- **Object 2** - To encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships.
- **Object 3** - To promote the adoption and the application of higher social, business, and professional standards.
- **Object 4** - To develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive, and serviceable citizenship.
- **Object 5** - To provide, through Kiwanis clubs, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build better communities.
- **Object 6** - To cooperate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism and goodwill
