Donna Wade introduced a member of the Aktion Club, who outlined the following, ‘For the past 3 years, our aktion club has made cards for our troops.



We make nice packages for them which include the card, candy, tooth brush, tooth paste and dental floss. We take them to ‘thank a soldier day’, which is on October 21.



Last year we made 685 packages and this year we want to make 2200 packages so that each box that is packed will have something from the Aktion Club.

The dental items cost us \$1000.00 and take candy and bags cost us almost \$900.00 and we were wondering if you could help us with some of the cost. Any amount your club could help us with would be great.

Many use the emergency room as their primary care facility and that is the reasoning behind an 'urgent care center' on the property.

Michael Mayne reported to us the consulting firms notes for the amount of dollars the medical center should be able to raise. That number is \$70M, which he noted is a lot of money. There will be a number of committees put together to raise money for the new facility. There will be Burbank neighborhood campaigns headed by Ed Mullens, Toluca Lake and the realtors will have a separate goal. He noted that everyone in Burbank has been touched by the emergency room at St. Joe's. Dr Angelique interjected that the emergency room and medical center have services generally only available at large university teaching facilities.



In response to questions, she told us that typically there are 4 Docs and 4-6 nurse practitioners in the ER, with 2 Docs 'on call'. The goal is to complete the project in 5 years, to break ground in 2019 and the they are already over 50% to the goal!! 2nd VP



presented the fine china mugs and they pulled the winning number ---- new member Caesar won!!! Hooray!!
