### THE THIRD PAGE MORE KIWANIS FACTS

The first convention was held in Cleveland with our name being “The National Kiwanis Club”. In 1919 we claimed independence from Allen Browne when we bought him out for \$17,500.00 in Alabama. The first international convention was held in Toronto, Canada in 1922, with the first ‘interruption in 1943 due to World War II. The International Council was formed to run the business until 1946 when conventions resumed. Real changes took place in 1987 when the House of Delegates eliminated gender as a qualification for membership and in 2015 Susan Petrosian became the first female International President!

- [Object 5](#) - To provide, through Kiwanis clubs, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build better communities.
- [Object 6](#) - To cooperate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism and
